4-H Horse Certificates, Project Records, and Riding Evaluations DUE MAY 15!

4-H Horse Certificates

All 4-H members planning to show a horse at the Ulster County Fair are required to turn in a 4-H Horse Certificate no later than **May 15**! Remember to include a copy of your current Coggin's test - test dated this year or last year. *Proof of rabies vaccination required - must be current, given more than 14 days prior to arrival at fairgrounds, and remain current for duration of the Fair.

4-H Project Records

Up-to-date 4-H Horse Project Records must be submitted with the 4-H Horse Certificates. Contact your 4-H Leader for the recommended Ulster County Project Record or contact Kristin at the 4-H Office at (845) 340-3990 ext. 340 or klf37@cornell.edu.

4-H Riding Evaluations

4-H Riding Evaluations must be performed for all 4-H youth who plan to show at the Ulster County Fair and other CCE/4-H Sponsored Events on the horse(s) they will be riding. A youth that has previously been evaluated to ride safely in Junior or Senior levels does not need to be re-evaluated to change of age from Jr. to Sr., unless there is a need for re-evaluation. Evaluation forms will be kept on file in the Ulster County 4-H Office. A youth that wishes to "move up" a level must be re-evaluated. Any Cloverbud youth must have been evaluated by the "Cloverbud – On the Ground Skills Evaluation" form, been involved in "riding experiences", and demonstrated their ability to ride safely before they are to be involved in "county sponsored" programs and events. All Cloverbud policies apply (see NYS 4-H Cloverbud Leader Handbook).

PLEASE NOTE: It is recommended that there be a riding level evaluation committee consisting of 3 individuals with suitable horse and riding experience to perform the evaluation. It is suggested that this committee consist of a 4-H leader, a parent of a 4-H youth and an instructor when possible; other possible combinations to be determined by the county Cornell Cooperative Extension Association or educator. A child may **NOT** be evaluated by their own parent or guardian.

The Book:


Weaving the Rainbow by George Ella Lyon and Illustrated by Stephanie Anderson


Club Chatter and Events Recap

What is the Tractor Safety Program?

This National Safe Tractor Program enables young workers (ages 14-19) to obtain a US Department of Labor Certificate of Training Certification which is required to operate farm tractors and equipment. Participants learn

important safety skills and gain an advantage when seeking employment at a lawn or landscaping business, golf course or farm. Health-H Challenge Tips

Long walks can turn into a hike – which is even more fun! On a hike we might want to carry water and snacks. We might find ourselves climbing hills and walking long distances.
