Beavers are Nature's Engineers

They Build:



Dams

Designed to block a stream, they are made of sticks, mud, and rocks. Dams are typically 100-200 feet long and 5-7 feet high. This creates a pond upstream for use as their habitat.



Canals

Built by the beaver to access fresh trees deeper in the forest, they provide protection and are used to float branches back to the pond.



Lodges

A hollow mound-like structure made of sticks and mud. It has at least two underwater entrances and raised dry platforms. Located in the center of a pond or along a streambank.



Burrows

Young beavers dig into the side of a stream bank to create temporary homes while building their dams and lodges.
