For the past 4 years, RAPP youth have participated in the YMCA winter running program which invites children to meet every Saturday to run together as a group and play running games. From January until early April, the children ran a total of 25.2 miles. At the Kid's

Classic in April, they will finish their last mile as a group on the track at Dietz Stadium. The total distance covered is equivalent to a full marathon. RAPP youth enjoyed the program this winter and look forward to continuing to run

beyond April thanks to the Road Runners Club of America who generously awarded RAPP a grant to continue the program.

With flowers blossoming and warmer weather finally upon us, RAPP encourages families to enjoy the spring with these fun activities. Strengthen familial bonds by enjoying time well spent together.

- 1. **Fly a kite** Spring is the perfect time to go fly a kite. Make your own or purchase one and work together to get it flying up in the air.
- 2. **Launch rockets** Building and launching rockets is a lot of fun for children and adults.
- 3. **Go barefoot** With warmer weather, spend some time outdoors barefoot. Feel the new grass underfoot and play around.
- 4. **Adopt a tree** Help out wildlife by adopting a tree. You can add a bird feeder or just leave some food out for the birds.
- 5. **Take family pictures** The years pass by quickly. Take some
- 6. family photos, and be certain to include yourself in them.
- 7. **Go to a cultural festival** Celebrate a culture dear to you or learn about a new one at a cultural festival.
- 3. **Go skating** Try your hand, or foot as the case may be, with some in-line skating.
